#### **AVOID THIS COSTLY ACT**

#### **DISCHARGING GRASS ON TO STREET**

Did you know that it is unlawful for grass to be blown on to a public street? When mowing your lawn, grass clippings cannot be discharged onto the street for a variety of reasons.

First, the grass clippings create a safety hazard to motorcyclists and other vehicular traffic. Second, the clippings eventually make their way into the stormwater collection system, resulting in clogged stormwater grates and stormwater swales.

Note that in addition to grass clippings, it is also unlawful

to discharge, place, or deposit leaves, mud, snow, or any other physical matter onto any street or road.

Violations will result in a fine not to exceed \$1,000, plus court costs.

## RECREATION COMMISSION

#### **Volunteers Needed**

Shrewsbury Township and New Freedom Borough recently joined forces to create a regional recreation commission.

The next step is for each municipality to appoint three (3) residents and one (1) elected official to serve on the eight (8) member recreation commission.

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#### **OFFICIAL OPENING DATE SET**

#### **NEW MUNICIPAL COMPLEX**

After months of delay waiting for an electric disconnect panel box (main power box into the building), final construction work and finishing touches have resumed, with an **opening date** set for **June 14, 2023**. An open house is being planned for early Fall of this year.

#### **Building Sold**

The Township administration building has been sold, and the property transferred to the new owner in March 2023. The new owner is Energywise Property Holding LLC and they will be moving their insulation business from York to this location. The building was sold for \$840,000 (cash), "as is" with no contingencies, and no inspections. The Township purchased the property in December 2006 for \$615,000.

#### **Temporary Meeting Location**

With the sale of the existing administration building, the offices will continue to operate at its current location; however, the remainder of the building is being occupied by the new owner. Therefore, all Township meetings, through June 2023 will be held at Fissels New Hope Church, 3426 Fissels Church Road, Glen Rock.

#### **New Complex Location**

The new municipal complex is located at 12341 Susquehanna Trail S, Glen Rock (at Hametown Park), approximately 1/2 mile south of the current location. Office hours remain unchanged at 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Monday - Thursday and 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. Friday. The telephone number remains the same at 717-235-3011.



### **Subdivision & Land Development Activity**

#### **NEWLY FORMED RECREATION COMMISSION**

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Following creation of the commission, a recreation director will be hired through a state grant, whereby the first year salary will be paid 100%, the 2nd year will pay 75%, the 3rd year will pay 50%, and the 4th year will pay 25%, with the 5th year salary being supported fully by recreation programming fees.

## 171 ACRES ADDED TO PRESERVED FARMS

The York County Agricultural Land Preservation Board announced the addition of 171.75 acres of preserved land, located in the Township, through the York County Agricultural Conservation Easement Program.

The additional acreage is owned by George O. Phillips, Jr. and Kimberly A. Swam, and is located along West Sieling Road, and affronts portions of Steltz Road.

Under the preservation program, the agricultural conservation easement places the restriction of commercial agricultural production in perpetuity (forever).

With the additional of this tract, the agricultural land preserved in Shrewsbury Township totals 3,763 acres and 28 farms.

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## CONTRACT AWARED MILLER PARK IMPROVEMENTS

Beginning in late August, you will begin to see construction activities at Miller Park, which is expected to last approximately two (2) months. Improvements to the park include the addition of two (2) pavilions with picnic tables, charcoal grills, concrete corn hole boards, additional benches along the walking trails, and a tot lot/youth playground.

The contract was awarded to Kinsley Construction at their low bid of \$592,000. Cost of the project will be funded with a \$281,800 grant received through the PA Department of Conservation & Natural Resources, with the balance of the project funded through recreation fees collected from new housing developers (\$2,500 for each new residential dwelling unit).



## **FIREWORKS...Know the Law**

With summer upon us, so comes the peak fireworks season. The following is a general list (not all inclusive) of the state law related to the use of consumer-grade fireworks:

- Cannot be discharged within 150 feet of any building or vehicle, whether or not the building is owned by the fireworks consumer.
- Cannot be discharged on public or private property without owner permission.
- Cannot be discharged within a building or vehicle, regardless if the building or vehicle is owner by the user of the consumer fireworks.
- Cannot be discharged while the person is under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance.
